

Aviva and Nathan....., being duly sworn, depose and say:

1. We are wife and husband, respectively, having been married on April 13, ..., in Brooklyn, N.Y. Both of us are U.S. citizens. On June 9, 2004, I, Aviva née, filed an I-130 Petition on behalf of my father, Yitzchok, a resident and citizen of Israel, with the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) Vermont Service Center (VSC). VCS approved this Petition on July 27, 2004, and forwarded it to the National Visa Center (NVC), where it was assigned the case number TLV2004..... We are making this affidavit in support of the processing by the NVC, and later by the American Consulate in Tel Aviv, Israel, of the application of Yitzchok for the issuance to him of an immigrant visa. More specifically, we are making this affidavit to supplement the USCIS Affidavit of Support Form I-864 that Aviva is filing on behalf of Yitzchok, as the sponsor who filed the alien relative petition on his behalf.

2. Ordinarily, our completed Form I-864 would be supported by copies of jointly-filed federal income tax returns for 2002, 2003, and 2004. We are hereby providing you with the explanation, called for by the Form I-864, as to why we are not submitting such returns.

3. Briefly stated, no returns for 2002, 2003, and 2004 accompany our I-864 because no federal income tax returns were filed for those years, inasmuch as our incomes during those years, both individually and combined, were below the level at which a federal tax filing was required. Despite our minimal income, during these 3 years we managed to live and to raise our children -, born October 18, 1998 in Manhasset, N.Y., and, born February 29, 1994 in Brooklyn, N.Y. - primarily through a combination of prior savings, returns on investments, and gifts and loans we received from family and friends.

4. Grateful as we have been to our family and friends for helping us to survive and even to flourish these past 4 years, we are fully aware of the burden this has been to them and the sacrifice they have made on our behalf. We are therefore joyous, both for them and for ourselves, that our financial situation began to improve greatly at the beginning of this year. In January of 2005, plans that have been in development for years finally came to fruition. As a result, on January 17, 2005, I, Nathan....., began working as the Chief Financial Officer for the company, a subsidiary of the Group, or, headquartered at Avenue, in Brooklyn, N.Y. 11205, telephone 718/...-..... My annual salary as CFO of is more than \$100,000.00. In addition, I have a 25% interest in (.....), a subsidiary of and; as a result of

my 25% interest, I earn an additional annual salary of \$50,000. My total annual income is thus in excess of \$150,000.00. This high income, and the potential for even higher income in the future, makes me feel confident that, in the coming years, I will be able to provide for my family very well, giving them all the necessities and comforts of life, without depending on any outside assistance, whether public or private. Within a relatively short time, I will even the complete the process I have already begun, which is to reimburse my friends and family for the generous financial help they kindly extended to us when we needed it. Attached to this affidavit as Exhibit 1 is an original letter dated June 22, 2005, from Mr., the Chief Executive Officer of &, providing additional details concerning my employment.
